Happy New Year!

You will notice this newsletter is Volume 45, Issue 1. Which means this is starting the 45th year a newsletter has been published by this lodge.

You may also recognize the date March 31, 1910. This is the date of the organizational meeting of Sverdrup lodge organized by 35 enrolled charter members. Our lodge will be celebrating its 104 birthday in March.

In 1914, the decision was made by the membership to establish a District - Yes, I think you've heard that this year is the 100th anniversary of District IV and will be celebrated at the District Convention in Fargo held on June 19-21, 2014.

I have often heard the saying - "How can you know where you are going if you don't know where you've been.?" I'll attempt to provide some of this for you.

In 1910, prior to district conventions, our lodge sent the lodge's secretary to the Headlodge Meeting in Grand Forks, held July 7, 8, 9, 1910.

In those early years there were Headlodge Meetings every year, and every year there was representation from Sverdrup.

In 1917 Bismarck was the host for the District Convention and it was held in the K. P. Hall. We have a picture of this gathering.

It wasn't until December 1919 that women were allowed to join our lodge. By January 1920 the had already elected several women to serve as officers.
