His "knife for cutting cheese" is 100 years old this year. Bjørklund, a businessman and inventor, based his design on a carpenter's planner. The modern cheese slicer, or 'Ostehøvel' in Norwegian, is a standard kitchen utensil in homes around Scandinavia.
