

Red Striped Vests

As we were assembled the other evening at the business meeting/installation of officers ceremony,, someone asked about the origin of the Sverdrup Vests. I didn't have an answer. I was on the original committee that determined the fabric and pattern and have had a vest ever since the first ones came to be.

A bit of research reminded me that in 1998 our lodge, Sverdrup 4-107 hosted the District IV Convention and we wanted some way to identify our members at the convention. We noticed other lodges were using blue or red, but we wanted something a bit more Norwegian. The decision was made to use the busserull fabric—the traditional workman's with sleeves and a standup collar and that the fabric should be red. Searching for the fabric we found a Norwegian shop in the Midwest that would supply the fabric and lodge members who volunteered to sew them. All went well!

It went well until we ran out of fabric and it was no longer available at the store or any other store in the US. Being problem solvers we determined the fabric was available in Norway but the cost of shipping was prohibitive. Plan B came to light, someone was taking a trip to Norway and able to purchase some fabric—we were back on track! Now, however, the fabric has been used and only those people who have chosen to recycle vests are allowing our newer members to join the vest team.

Going back a few years further, in 1980 Sverdrup hosted the District IV Convention and thinking along the same idea of a uniform type of clothing it was determined the women would wear a hverdag's bunad, which translates to an "everyday" national costume. They were cotton. A striped top which was similar to a vest and a plain colored matching skirt. A long sleeved shirt, generally white or cream color was worn with the garment.

The ladies started sewing and there were nearly 100 hverdag's bunader in existence at that time, nearly all were different, and all very nice. Editor
